

Pastor's Message

"Jesus said to the Pharisees: There was a rich man who dressed in purple garments and fine linen and dined sumptuously each day. And lying at his door was a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who would gladly have eaten his fill of the scraps that fell from the rich man's table."

The sheer wealth of America is staggering. So is the abject poverty. The gap between the rich and the poor, if we took enough time to think about it, would take our breath away.



There is a gap between the rich man in the Gospel and the beggar sitting at his gate. In this parable, Jesus isn't criticizing the rich man because he has money—He is criticizing him because of his self-indulgence. The rich man lived like there was no tomorrow because he didn't believe in the afterlife. There was no need to think about anyone or anything beyond himself. His eating, which is a symbol of his self-indulgence, makes him oblivious to the poor living around him. Poor Lazarus doesn't want to be rich, he just wants the scraps from the rich man's table.

This parable highlights an important theme in Luke's Gospel: self-indulgence creeps up on us and consumes us. The more we have, the more we want, and that blinds us to the reality that there are people around us who cry out for justice. We fail to see how our self-indulgent attitudes and actions eat away at our spirit, erodes our faith, and justifies our gluttonous lifestyle.

What condemned the rich man to an eternity separated from God is that he believed that he was complete in himself and that he didn't need anyone else. What gave Lazarus the gift of eternity with God was his knowledge that he knew that he was incomplete. In his poverty, he relied on God and others.

Who has God placed at the door of your life to remind you to embody the compassion of Jesus Christ? What are the sins and urges that tempt you to "Keep the door closed" so you don't have to see the poor and suffering in the world? Are you more like the rich man or Lazarus?

School News

New This Year—Preschool Faith Formation Curriculum

Our Transitional Kindergarten and PreK children have the opportunity to engage weekly in an interactive, discovery based Religion program led by our Director of Evangelization and Catechesis, Cathy Ashton. Mrs. Ashton has a Bachelor's degree in Elementary and Early Childhood Education and is certified in the state of NE to teach the same. This program will incorporate the weekly Sunday Gospel reading shared in an age appropriate way. The children will then have the opportunity to engage in hands-on, cooperative learning centers to learn more about our Catholic Faith and God's love for them. Going forward, parents will have an opportunity to learn more about this program and become empowered and equipped as the primary religious educators of their children. Additionally, all of these classrooms have a designated prayer area where a child can go and spend some quiet time with our Lord at any time during his or her school day. The goal of this program is to help these young children to experience our Lord's love and mercy in an age appropriate and engaging way.

Our Early Preschool and Preschool children participate in Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, a program gaining popularity in the area with many programs having waiting lists. Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) started in 1954 in Rome, Italy. It is a Montessori based faith formation method based on Scripture and Liturgy for the young child. There are 3 levels. This school year we began Level I, the 3-6 year old child, with the 3 and 4 year old Preschool classes. The children come to a special prepared environment for them located in the parish library one time per week called the atrium. In the atrium so far this year we have been learning how we walk and talk quietly and how to quiet our bodies so that we can hear the Father's voice. The materials made for them in the atrium allow the child to work with them, further contemplate the truths that are being proclaimed and encounter the real person of Jesus. Being involved with CGS for almost 9 years, Brooke Keller leads CGS here at St. Stephen's and oversees 4 other atria here in Omaha. She completed her 180 hours of formation to become a certified catechist in both Level I and II in 2014. You can also go to www.cgsusa.org to learn more about CGS.
