

Pastor's Message

As they were going they were cleansed. And one of them, realizing he had been healed, returned, glorifying God in a loud voice; and he fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. He was a Samaritan.

The Gospel reading today has many similarities with the first reading. Both include a cure of leprosy, thankfulness for God's goodness, and a foreigner who expresses faith and gratitude. The Law of Moses required that a leper who has been healed must present himself to the priest of the temple so that the healing may be confirmed and the person may be received back into the community again. Because leprosy was highly contagious, those who lived with the affliction had to live outside of the town, away from family, neighbors, and their worshipping community. Many times they had to live in the caves where the dead were buried. Being healed meant that the leper's body was made whole, but it also meant that the community was made whole again because an ill member was brought back to them.

In this particular story, one of the lepers that was healed was a Samaritan. Samaritans and Jews disliked each other, and they avoided contact with one another whenever possible. In writing this story, St. Luke surprises the reader by suggesting that unexpected people prove to be truly faithful and religious. No Jew would have expected that the single righteous leper would have been the Samaritan.

In our own day we have "Samaritans," people who are rejected because of their faith, their ethnic background, and the choices they make about how they live their lives. We are constantly making judgments about people based on what we observe or on what we have heard about them. What the story of the Samaritan teaches us is that only Jesus Christ can judge peoples' hearts. Those who are rejected by us and by society may be the ones who have greater faith than we have. Now is the time to let go of the harsh and critical judgments that we make of others and put on the attitude of Christ, who welcomed sinners and those who were considered unclean. Only then will we be found worthy of heaven.


