Pastor's Message

The Apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith." The Lord replied, "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you."

The Apostles came to Jesus and asked for more faith. They were implying that their faith wasn't large enough to work the wonders that Jesus was sending them out to perform. In response, Jesus doesn't even listen to their request. He doesn't promise them more faith. Jesus just says, "Start with what you have, and you will get all you want."

Jesus reveals the truth about all of us in this teaching. How often do we come up with excuses for not living as he calls us to live? We can't pray because we don't have sufficient faith or time. We can't be charitable, because we don't have enough money. We can't stand up for issues of justice, peace, and equality because it might make us unpopular. We can't stop eating or drinking or using drugs because we don't have enough grace. When the Apostles came to Jesus with the request for more, He objects: "Don't even think about asking for more, because you already have more than enough. If you had faith the size of a mustard seed, you could work miracles."

God has already given us the faith, time, financial resources, and grace to perform miracles. The rest is up to us. We have to stop making excuses for our apathy and complacency and know that God will certainly use us as His instruments if we would only step out of our comfort zones, put down the excuses, roll up our sleeves, and get to work. The power of God's love shown in Jesus was constantly demonstrated to transform the lives of those who were touched by it. The blind, the lame, the leper, tax collectors, prostitutes, and many other sinners had lives transformed by Jesus.

What are the excuses that we use to reject our mission as disciples of Jesus Christ? What is the primary obstacle that prevents me from trusting that God will provide all that I need to be His faithful servant in the world?



Fair Trade Sales Coming Up

Your favorite Fair Trade coffees, chocolates and other items will be available for purchase or order on **Sunday, October 13** in the dining room. The items come from SERRV.ORG and EQUALEXCHANGE.COOP - both organizations support fair trade by ensuring that artisans and farmers living in poverty are treated with respect and dignity and are paid fairly for their work.

"HUNGER DOESN'T TAKE A DAY OFF".....Did you know that nearly one in six children is living in poverty and almost 13% of Nebraskans don't know where their next meal is coming from. **For many of us, it's a matter of when we eat, not if we eat.** The St. Stephen's Food Pantry is OPEN to all in our parish family and the greater community who are in need. One of the **Corporal Works of Mercy** calls us to **FEED THE HUNGRY**. Through our food donation drives and individual financial donations our parish family has been able to serve those in need of food. From June-September of 2019, we have served 48 families, 88 adults and 109 children. Our food pantry is fortunate to have several volunteers who come every Monday and Thursday to ensure that our families are served. We provide not only food items, but a listening ear and we ensure their dignity and confidentiality. The receiving families share their great appreciation to our faith family. We have several food drives coming in November/Lent with our school children, Knights of Columbus and our RE Program. Please support these drives so we, at St. Stephen's can continue our ministry. Going forward, our parish will be extending our generosity to several other food pantries (Catholic Charities and Open Door Mission) so that they are able to help support their families. If you stop by the GPC for a meeting, a Bible Study or any other parish activity consider dropping off food items. If at any time, you would like to see the pantry, call Deacon Denny (402) 861-4538 for a visit and ask about volunteering. We are always ready to open our door! With many Blessings!
