Pastor's Message

"See that you not be deceived, for many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he,' and 'The time has come.' Do not follow them! When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for such things must happen first, but it will not immediately be the end."

All the ancient Scriptures and the traditions of faith must have led the Jews of Jesus' time to believe that the temple would never be destroyed or torn down. After all, the temple itself was built because God commanded that it be built as His dwelling place among the human race. It had survived



destruction twice before and had been rebuilt. The prophecy by Jesus that there would be destruction on the earth and that the temple will be destroyed was beyond imagining, but it came true on September 7, in the year 70 A.D., when the third temple was demolished by the Roman Empire. Only one wall was left standing, the now-famous "Wailing Wall."

Our Lord's prophecy about the temple came true, but there are also other structures of our world that will be torn down or destroyed. Think of the destruction that is taking place today that is dismantling families, religions, cultures, and nations. Think about our fear of terrorism and violence. In a world filled with the constant threat of destruction, violence, and the dismantling of our values, Jesus offers a clear, simple plan to maintain our security against evil: "Do not be terrified!" If we truly believe that, no matter what happens in our world today or tomorrow, that Jesus will not even allow a hair of our head to be harmed, then we will "in patience possess our souls."

We can waste so much time and energy being afraid of what might happen to us that it prevents us from truly living today. Being afraid of violence, destruction, and terrorism is really about a lack of trust. Jesus promises that if we have faith in Him, we will have eternal life—no matter what happens here on earth. Let us pray that we might have faith strong enough to take us through these difficult days in our world. It is a sad reality that sin and evil have a strong presence in our world. We can find great hope in knowing that God's presence is even stronger.
