

### Pastor's Message—From Father Dave

Jesus said to his disciples: "You have heard that it was said, 'An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.' But I say to you, offer no resistance to one who is evil... You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father..."



Jesus continues His teaching through the Sermon on the Mount. This significant lesson by the Master begins with the Beatitudes, and then He continues to describe what it means to be one of His followers. Jesus takes several of the important laws of the Jewish faith and says, "You have heard that it was said..."
Jewish law did allow for revenge or "payback" for harm that was done to a person, and they allowed people to pronounce that their enemies were "dead to them." Jesus then says "But I say to you..." And in His words we learn that the true law of God, embodied by Jesus Himself, is to embrace peace, forgiveness,

Sometimes it is almost impossible to feel love for a person who has harmed us. Sometimes we feel anger, hatred, and a desire for revenge, and we allow those feelings to form the person we become. As we give in to the darkness of sin, our relationships, attitudes, words, and actions are affected. The kind of love that is described by Sacred Scripture isn't always based on a feeling. True love is a deliberate choice, an act of the will. We have to choose to see the people that we consider enemies as children of God, created in His image and likeness. Sometimes, that's difficult work.

Our deliberate choices every day to love one another must allow our light to shine in the world, as Jesus teaches earlier in the Sermon on the Mount. Do our words and actions make the love of God present in the world? Or are our attitudes and our lives contributing to the darkness?

"Now there is a final reason I think that Jesus says, 'Love your enemies.' It is this: that love has within it a redemptive power. And there is a power there that eventually transforms individuals. Just keep being friendly to that person. Just keep loving them, and they can't stand it too long -Martin Luther King Jr.





## WHY DO WE DO THAT?

### Catholic Life Explained:


**Ouestion:** 

Is gossip a mortal sin?

To really ask this question, we must consider the Eighth Commandment: "You shall not bear false witness." In its reflections on this commandment, The Catechism of the Catholic Church invites us to not only think about what bearing "false witness" means, but to also consider how we understand the truth and how we communicate more broadly. This is why so much of this section of the Catechism has to do with the gift of language.

With this in mind, we will notice that the word "gossip" isn't used by the Catechism. Instead, we find the words "detraction" and "calumny," which are actually two forms that gossip can take, and both can be quite serious. First, detraction is the of revealing "another's faults and failings to persons who did not know them," without morally valid reasons. Calumny, by extension, is saying something about another person that is untrue, and it is sinful because it "harms the reputation of others and gives occasion for false judgements" (see no. 2477).

In all of our communication, we have to always recognize that we have a moral obligation to the truth and to always work to protect the reputation and honor of our neighbors (see no. 2479). Gossip can, in fact, prove to be a very serious sin. After all, the Catechism reminds us: "No one is bound to reveal the truth to someone who does not have the right to know it" (no. 2489). When we have gossiped, especially if we are aware we have damaged another person's good name or reputation, we want to make every effort to undo the damage we have done, including seeking the grace and forgiveness offered in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.@LPi
