

Pastor's Message—From Father Dave

"At that time Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil. He fasted for forty days and forty nights, and afterwards he was hungry. The tempter approached and said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, command that these stones become loaves of bread..."

Tradition says that Jesus was tempted with every temptation known to humanity. This was to show that He was totally human and that He would understand our own human condition. But temptations are not sins. No matter how strong the temptations are they don't become sinful until we succumb to their power.

The temptations that confronted Jesus in the desert are the same basic temptations that we deal with. We try to convince ourselves that we should be strong and independent. We should be able to take care of ourselves. Since hunger is the most basic need in all of us, the devil starts with the temptation for food. He moves, then, to a temptation of self-sufficiency and power.

I believe that God allows temptation to be a part of our lives because it helps us to know how strong we are—and more importantly, how strong God is! God helps us to go into our own deserts to confront the temptations of life and to know that we aren't alone in our battle with evil. Just as the Spirit led Jesus into the desert, we are led into the desert of Lent, where we come face-to-face with the temptations and sin in our lives. We pray that we will rely on God's strength and grace to turn our backs on the many temptations that come to us every day.





WHY DO WE DO THAT? **Catholic Life Explained:**

Ouestion:

Can you recommend some good books for Lenten spiritual reading?

Answer:

On more than one occasion, a coach being interviewed about his team-successful or not--will be asked about the next step. The inevitable response includes something about getting back to basics. Reviewing the fundamentals of the sport strengthens performance and builds confidence. The best Lenten reading takes us back to the fundamentals.

If Lent is the time for the Church to be on retreat, then we should focus on the texts that help us deepen our understanding of our faith. Spend time reading one of the Gospels, and use a Scripture commentary to learn all you can about the passion of Jesus. Read about the lives of the saints, especially your patron saint and that of your parish. Perhaps there is some local candidate for sainthood, like Father Walter Ciszek, SJ, who wrote several faith-inspiring books.

Finally, you can use the Catechism of the Catholic Church to learn more about the church's teachings and beliefs. The sections on prayer and the Mass are really great reflections. Focusing on the basics really helps us take another step forward in our faith. We have not only a better understanding of what we believe and practice, but also why we believe. With that belief comes the confidence we need to be better, more faithful witnesses to Christ.






