## Pastor's Message—From Father Dave

"Before the cock crows you will deny me three times."

Palm Sunday marks the beginning of the holiest days of our Church year. This week our parish will join with all of the Catholic communities throughout the world in celebrating our Lord's passion, death, and resurrection. The liturgies that we celebrate this week will help draw us into the reality of the Paschal Mystery.



The season of Lent has prepared us for the journey through these holy days. Our prayer, fasting, and almsgiving have renewed our hearts through the grace of Jesus Christ, who died on the cross for our sins. The sacrifices that we made have helped peel away the layers of sin and neglect in our lives, so that we might enter the great mystery of new life that comes through suffering and death.

I encourage all of you to make time this week to participate in our Holy Week liturgies. They are some of the most beautiful liturgical events of our Catholic tradition. Also, if you have not yet celebrated the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we have times available this week. Finally, please pray for the many members of our parish family who will be receiving the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist in the Easter Season. Together, may we be nourished and strengthened by the Sacramental life of the Church, as we continue on our Pilgrimage to eternal life.

"The Cross is the word through which God has responded to evil in the world. Sometimes it may seem as though God does not react to evil, as if he is silent. And yet, God has spoken, he has replied, and his answer is the Cross of Christ: a word which is love, mercy, forgiveness. It also reveals a judgment, namely that God, in judging us, loves us. Let us remember this: God judges us by loving us. If I embrace his love then I am saved, if I refuse it, then I am condemned, not by him, but my own self, because God never condemns, he only loves and saves."





### WHY DO WE DO THAT? **Catholic Life Explained:**

#### **Question:**

What is a pilgrimage? Why do people go on them?

#### Answer

A pilgrimage is a spiritual journey to visit a holy site, such as the shrine of a saint, a place where the Blessed Virgin Mary has appeared, or an historic church or chapel. What makes a pilgrimage different from a vacation and a pilgrim distinct from a tourist is the spirit in which the journey is made. Pilgrimages are really a symbol of our spiritual journey in life, reminding us that this world is not our true home and that we spend our lives journeying to our homeland, which is the Kingdom of God. Pilgrimages — which can be as involved as a trip to Rome or the Holy Land or as simple as visiting the Blessed Sacrament in a local parish church — are also an opportunity for us to step out of the rhythms and limits of our daily lives to seek out connection with God in a special way, by visiting a holy place. At times, such as on a special feast, a jubilee, or the anniversary of the dedication of the church, special graces (called "indulgences") can also be offered to pilgrims, helping to enrich our experience of the celebration. In the end, pilgrimages are an ancient act of devotion and something that each of us can put into practice, helping us to discover how God is present in the world around us, in places both near and far. ©LPi




