



Jesus said to him, "Have vou come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." - Jn 20:29

Pastor's Message—From Father Dave

Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, 'Peace be with you.' When He had said this, He showed them His hands and His side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you..."



On the evening of the first day of the week, the disciples are sitting in the upper room, locked away because of fear and confusion. Mary Magdalene has brought them her news: "I have seen Him!" They did not believe what she told them, but they came together to wait for Him. Suddenly He stood in their midst. He spoke to them and gave them their mission. He said that He is sending them in the same way that the Father sent Him into the world. Even when they are not invited into peoples' lives, they must go anyway to forgive sin and bring peace to a broken world. Jesus even gave them the gift of the Spirit that day, so that they would have God's presence and power with them every step of the journey.

What happened next? Did they do what He told them to do? No. They did not go outside of the locked room. They did not go out to forgive sin or to heal the world. They remained together, locked away in fear. Finally Thomas comes in late. They told him that they had seen the Lord and how He had sent them into the world. It was then that Thomas started to doubt. If they had really seen Him, if He had really sent them into the world, if He had armed them with the power of the Holy Spirit, why were they still

So often when we hear the story about Doubting Thomas we compare ourselves to his lack of faith. But what about the lack of faith shown in the others who stayed locked away in fear after receiving the Holy Spirit? We ourselves have received an abundance of the Spirit's presence and love in Baptism and Confirmation, and our faith is strengthened every time we receive the Lord's resurrected presence in the Eucharist. If that is the case, why aren't we taking up the mission that was given to us—the same mission given by Jesus to the disciples?

In this Easter season, it is time for us to trust in the power of the Spirit that has been given to us, get out of our comfortable chairs, and do the work of healing, forgiving, and loving that has been entrusted to us. When other people see us and the way that we choose to live our lives, do they see people filled with the Holy Spirit, or do they ask, "How can we believe in the resurrection of the Lord when they are not living their faith in Him?"

"Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

Congratulations to the young people of our parish who will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation this week. As you are guided by the Holy Spirit, may you be bold and fearless in the way you live your faith in the world!

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Question: Do children need to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation before their First Communion?

Answer: For centuries the Catholic Church has taught that a person needs to be in a state of grace (free from mortal sins) in order to worthily receive the Eucharist. To that end, Catholics should make an effort to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation any time they recognize the need for the sacrament (and in keeping with the precept of the Church that asks that we celebrate this sacrament at least once each year).

In the case of children preparing for their First Communion, the Code of Canon Law is very clear that they should also celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation before receiving the Eucharist for the first time: "It is the responsibility, in the first place, of parents and those who take the place of parents as well as of the pastor to see that children who have reached the use of reason are correctly prepared and are nourished by the divine food as early as possible, preceded by sacramental confession" (Canon 914). While some might question the significance of the Sacrament of Reconciliation — especially in the case of children who might not fully understand the reality of sin or the meaning of the sacrament itself — a child's "First Confession" can be a wonderful time for families to reflect together on the quality of their relationships, how they put their faith into practice, and, when it is possible, to celebrate the sacrament as a family. In the end, the celebration of these two sacraments marks important moments in the spiritual journeys of children and we hope their "First Confession" and "First Communion" help instill in them a love of the sacraments of the Church. **©LPi**


