

Pastor's Message—From Father Dave

"When they entered the city they went to the upper room where they were staying, Peter and John and James and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James son of Alphaeus, Simon the Zealot, and Judas son of James. All these devoted themselves with one accord to prayer, together with some women, and Mary the mother of Jesus, and His brothers."



Once Jesus ascended into heaven, the beloved that He left behind gather in the upper room to reflect on what had happened and to prepare for what was to come. The first followers of Jesus remain faithful to His instructions to wait in Jerusalem so that the promise of the gift of the Spirit might be fulfilled. They take this opportunity to pray and reflect in peace and quiet before the fire of the Holy Spirit fills their hearts and sends them to proclaim the Gospel to all nations.

It is important for us as Jesus' beloved in the world today to follow the example of the first followers of Our Lord. It is good for us to find peace and quiet, to reflect on the past events of our lives and to prayerfully prepare for what is to come. So often we are bombarded with people, events, and problems to solve that we fail to take the time to find meaning in our lives. We fail to take a prayerful look at our busy existence to see how God continues to be present and how He shares His grace and love with us. No wonder we sometimes have problems recognizing God present in our lives. We don't look for Him in prayer often enough!

When is the last time that you had an "upper room" experience, where you shut out the noise of life to prayerfully reflect on the past and ask God for wisdom, courage, and faith for the future?





WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Question: Why does the Church have different liturgical cycles?

Answer: While most Catholics know that the Church Year is divided into various seasons (e.g. Advent, Christmas, Ordinary Time, etc.), many are unaware that the one Church Year is not like the one that follows. While the main seasons and feasts are the same from year to year, the 3-year cycle for Sundays and the 2-year cycle for weekdays means that, as a general rule, the readings in the Lectionary that we hear at Mass will change from year to year, helping us to have a richer encounter with Sacred Scripture. Each new cycle begins with the beginning of the liturgical year, the First Sunday of Advent. The reasoning behind this innovation is outlined in Sacrosanctum Concilium, the "Dogmatic Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy" of the Second Vatican Council: "The treasures of the bible are to be opened up more lavishly, so that richer fare may be provided for the faithful at the table of God's word. In this way a more representative portion of the holy scriptures will be read to the people in the course of a prescribed number of years" (no. 51). This was fully achieved in 1969 when the new cycles of readings were approved by Pope Saint Paul VI. ©LPi
