## Respect Life Sunday



#### Pastor's Message—From Father Dave

"Amen, I say to you, tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God before you."

Whenever we hear the Gospel writers speak of "tax collectors and prostitutes," we understand them to be code words for "big-time sinners." These two groups of people were rejected by the religious leaders of Jesus' time, but Jesus Himself welcomed them, loved them,



and forgave them. Knowing that the religious leaders of His time were not approving of the company He was keeping, Jesus tells the parable of a vineyard owner who had two sons. The first son said that he would obey his father and go into the vineyard, but he didn't go. The other son first refused, but then changed his mind and went. Jesus then asks the question, "Which of the two did his father's will?" The answer? The second one did the father's will. Even though he refused at first, he had a change of heart.

This parable is difficult for us to hear because of the judgments we make against other people. It is out of our realm of understanding to think that God would forgive the most notorious of sinners in our midst. And yet, that's how God's love and mercy works: God never gives up hope that a sinner will repent and do His will. The real issue is with those who are self-righteous, those who believe that they are better than everyone else—and whose hearts are not moved by the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The unwillingness to do the Father's will, while paying lip service to it, will take us out of the reach of God's embrace and place us in darkness.

The spirit of repentance is the foundation of receiving the gift of grace from God and of receiving the gift of eternal life one day. There will be those who are greater sinners than we who will have the opportunity for life in heaven. That may be difficult for us to fathom, but we remember that God's ways are not our ways. God will show abundant generosity to those who repent of their sinfulness, whether they are saints or notorious sinners.



# WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

**Question:** Can anyone offer the Anointing of the Sick to a sick or dying person, or is that only something a priest can do?

Answer: The Letter of James speaks to us of the ancient tradition of a special anointing and blessing of those who are sick: "Is there anyone sick among you? Let him send for the presbyters of the Church and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord ... If he has committed any sins, they will be forgiven him" (5:14, 15b). This passage forms the foundation for the theology of the sacrament that we call "Anointing of the Sick." In keeping with what we read in the Letter of James and the ancient tradition of the Church, the anointing of a person of who sick or dying many only be performed by a priest or bishop.

Although deacons and other members of the Church are not able to celebrate the sacrament with a person who is sick, we can read Sacred Scripture and pray with and for those who are ill. Resources like the Book of Blessings also contain special blessings that can be celebrated by deacons or lay ministers. In the end, we want to be sure that we show a special care and concern for the sick, helping them to always experience God's loving comfort through made tangible through our acts of charity and service. ©LPi

# ADORATION OF THE EUCHARIST



#### Mondays, 7-8 PM, Worship Space

The practice of Adoration dates back to the early Church but surged in popularity during the Middle Ages. It remains an important part of the prayer life of millions of Catholics. During Eucharistic Adoration, the Eucharist is sometimes displayed in a monstrance, a metal stand that resembles a sunburst that holds a consecrated host. Other times, it is kept in a ciborium (the dish which hosts are distributed during Holy Communion) inside of a tabernacle. A red candle signals the presence of Jesus.

May the merciful love of Jesus draw more and more souls to adore and worship him in Eucharistic Adoration.




