Pastor's Message—From Father Dave

"I know how to live in humble circumstances; I know also how to live with abundance... I have learned the secret of being well-fed and of going hungry, of living in abundance and of being in need."

In writing his letter to the Philippians, Saint Paul is teaching us a valuable lesson even today. Wealth is something that you can hold in your hand or put in your wallet or wrap around your shoulders when you are cold. The wealth of this world presents the

illusion of well-being and security—but what happens when the stock market crashes or the kids drop out of school, your spouse leaves, or illness comes into your home? It's not a matter of "if" we will have troubles in life that money and possessions can't cure, it's a matter of "when." Then it becomes very clear that relying on abundance as a way of survival is one sure way to destruction.

So, what do we count on if it isn't wealth? Poverty isn't any better way to live, as those who are poor will tell you. So, what is the secret? According to Saint Paul, the secret is the wisdom to rely on the strength of God. Saint Paul learned this lesson the hard way, as he had to endure persecution, rejection, torture, and imprisonment. He had many blessed moments in his ministry, but there were other times when surviving a beating was the only blessing that he could count. Paul's absolute faith in the blessings that only God could provide gave him peace and serenity in those times of rejection and loss.

Paul's secret is our secret. We cannot rely on anything that the world considers as wealth. We can only place our trust in the wealth of God's love and grace. Everything else in life can be taken away from us at a moment's notice. The only thing that is everlasting is God's love. The secret, then, of living in abundance and in poverty is having the wisdom to rely on God for everything that we need.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Question: Is it right to sue someone? Isn't it a way of getting revenge?

Answer: Revenge is inflicting harm for harm's sake, the idea of an eye for an eye, a tooth for a tooth, and then some. There is often a fine line between justice and mercy, between compensation and forgiveness. Unfortunately, things can happen to us that cause harm, suffering, and damage, regardless of people's intentions. When someone is hurt, especially in such a way that special care or treatment is required, the cost of that care needs to be paid.

In a perfect world, those with special needs, handicaps, or disabilities would find the help and care they need, including those who are injured or hurt. But justice is not always forthcoming, and people are not always fair. So, using the legal system to right a wrong is sometimes the only option.

In some cases, it is the only way that people can get the help they need and deserve. However, frivolous lawsuits, or 'fishing for money' is not only unfair, but immoral as well. The law is there to protect people and making use of it when necessary is a good thing. ©LPi



YOUR STEWARDSHIP DOLLARS AT WORK

Throughout the past fiscal year, we have continued to update our facilities to better serve our parishioners and school families. Although the below is not an exhaustive list, we have highlighted the initiatives that most impact the people we serve. We are grateful for your continued stewardship which makes these improvements possible.

- New chairs/kneelers in our Daily Mass Chapel
- Handicap Accessible doors at all six entrances on campus including the church, school and parish center
- New flooring in our school's kindergarten classrooms (carpet) and middle school science labs (vinyl tile)
- Continued update of heating and cooling control system which allows for campus-wide temperature control (room-by-room vs. facility-wide)
- New air-conditioning unit servicing the school and parish offices
- New water heater and water softener that serves the entire campus
- Painting throughout the campus including in the kitchen, school entry doors, counselor's office, early childhood bathrooms, and re-striping of all campus parking lots
- Kitchen updates including a new dishwasher, faucets, ovens, and meal trays (used for school lunches, Fish Frys and Sunday breakfasts)
- Landscape updates including shrubbery screens on the north and south lawns, as well as, new trees on the west lawn
