

Pastor's Message—From Father Dave

"Let me now sing of my friend, my friend's song concerning his vineyard. My friend had a vineyard on a fertile hillside... What more was there to do for my vineyard that I had not done? Why, when I looked for the crop of grapes, did it bring forth wild grapes?"



In the first reading this weekend, Isaiah's touching words are written as poetry. They portray God as a tender friend who lovingly cares for the vineyard. These words are deeply personal. Isaiah uses the word "friend" three times in the first three verses, which indicates God's deep love and affection for His people. The use of the "friend" image makes the betrayal in the final verses even more painful. Anyone who has ever been betrayed by a friend will understand the heartache that God experiences when His beloved people turn their backs on Him and the gifts that He provides for them. Despite all the tender care that God puts into building and tending the vineyard, the people respond by allowing the vineyard to become overgrown with thorns and thistles, and the harvest rots in the field.

During our lives God prepares us to bring forth good fruit from our labors but many times our sinful attitudes and behavior render our work and devotion fruitless. We should think of the vineyard as valuable property which provides abundance for all peoples—especially the poor. But this really hasn't happened, and the poor continue to be poor while the rich continue to grow richer. Isaiah teaches in this parable that God's response is to bring ruin to the once fertile vineyard as a punishment for Israel's

We must realize that God continues to build and care for His vineyard, and He gives the produce to us as a complete gift. In turn, He requires us to be responsible stewards of the gifts that He gives to us and to use those gifts to care for one another. But how often do we refuse to share what has been given to us because of our own selfishness and greed? How many people continue to go without food, clothing, and shelter in our community and in our world because we want to keep the wealth for ourselves? God's abundant life and friendship come to us in so many ways. It is up to us to care for the gifts of the vineyard. At the time of the harvest, God will ask each of us, "What grapes have you yielded from the fertile vineyard that I built and entrusted to you?" How will we answer?

WHY DO WE DO THAT? **Catholic Life Explained:**

Question: How can a priest counsel people about marriage when he has never been married?

Answer: If a marriage counselor is in a bad marriage does that mean that he or she will be a bad counselor? If one's counseling ability depended upon firsthand experience, would that require counselors to be perfect before they can help others? Obviously not. Some of the skills necessary to help others do come out of personal life experience. But you don't need personal, first-hand experience in order to understand something. We would not think that a doctor, who is an oncologist, would not be able to treat cancer because he himself has never been sick. We also would not expect every doctor to treat cancer. It is the same with priests.

Essentially marriage is a relationship and we've all been involved in different kinds of relationships: in our family, with our friends, and with God. And so counseling people about marriage is really helping them to look at the issues that really are part of their relationship, finding ways to better understand themselves in relationship to one another and in relationship to God. In many ways a priest's training, background, and experience, as well as his personal knowledge of many different relationships in families and couples, gives him a broad background from which to draw upon. Most priests are quite capable of helping couples prepare for marriage and discussing the issues that are important as they begin their life together. And they do not do it alone. With the help of married couples and specially trained counselors, most parishes offer a very good preparation for the sacrament of marriage. ©LPi


Adoration of the Holy Eucharist

Mondays, 7-8 PM | Worship Space

What do you do during Adoration?

Once you've decided to go to Eucharistic Adoration, the next common question to answer is what you should or can do while there. Catholics who attend for the first time feel at a loss regarding what they should be doing. Should you sit or kneel? Is it ok that one person is reading while another seems to be writing something in a notebook? Questions like these are normal. What matters is that you have the desire to deepen your walk with Jesus.

One of the most foundational things you can do is to "be there." Leave all of your fear about specifics at the door and simply be still. Pray from your heart, tell Him what made you happy or what upset you and then listen. You can write in a prayer journal, pray the rosary, or slowly read scripture. These are all acceptable actions to take to experience the blessing of Adoration of the Eucharist. Come, rest with Him in Adoration at anytime in the Adoration Chapel or during our weekly Adoration times.


