Pastor's Message—From Father Dave

"Well done, my good and faithful servant. Since you were faithful in small matters, I will give you great responsibilities. Come, share your master's joy."

How do you feel about taking risks? Are you bold in living and in making decisions about your future? Or are you cautious and afraid to step out of your comfort zone?

People who are afraid of taking risks would not be happy with the first two servants in our Gospel this weekend. Jesus tells the parable of a master who gives his possessions to three of his servants before he leaves on a journey. The rest of the parable is about how each servant used the master's gift. The first two servants took a risk and invested the "talents" that were entrusted to them; the third servant, acting out of fear, went off and buried the money. When the master returns, he wants to know how each of the servants cared for his money. He is very pleased to hear that the first two invested the money and came back with double the amount. When he hears that the third servant was afraid and buried the money, he gets upset with the servant, and he takes his gift away from him.

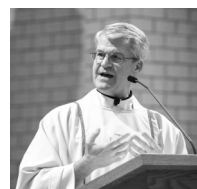
This parable is about the invitation that we all receive to use the gifts and talents that God gave to us to multiply good in the world. I believe that this is the basic teaching of stewardship, that we are all called to leave this world in better shape than when we first entered it. As pastor, this is my philosophy about being a steward of Saint Stephen the Martyr parish. It is my primary goal to leave this parish in better shape than when I came here in 2017. I hope that this is your goal too, and that you have this desire to leave your family, neighborhood, parish, community, and world in better shape through your generosity and your bold decision to "invest" the gifts and talents that God has entrusted to you.

Do not be driven by fear. Be bold in sharing the good things that God has entrusted to you!

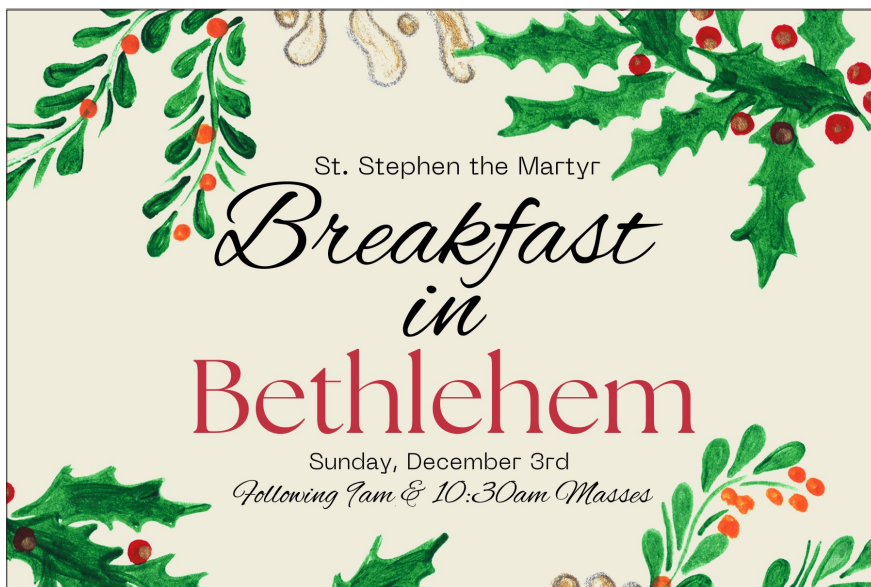

New Votive Display



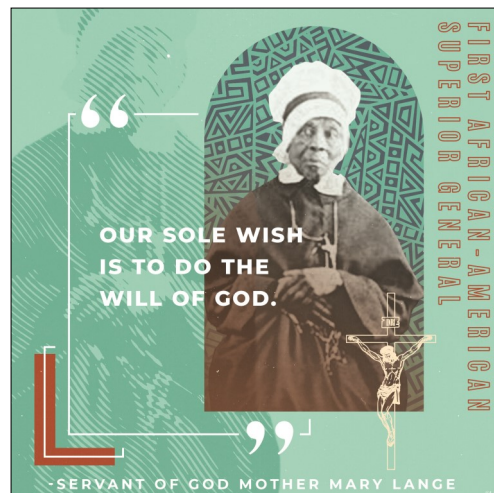

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Question: If it isn't only for people who are dying, when should someone receive the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick?

Answer: One of the unfortunate realities in the Church today is that so few people understand the meaning and value of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, largely because so many people still mistakenly think of this sacrament as "Last Rites" or "Extreme Unction."

In his life and ministry, Jesus healed the sick. In this sacrament, the Church continues the healing mission of Jesus and, in hope, prays that God will grant healing to the person who is suffering. But even if there is no physical healing, the sacrament offers spiritual healing through the Holy Spirit's gifts of peace and courage. And so, anyone who is living with serious illness (including emotional or psychological illness) and the elderly are encouraged to celebrate this sacrament when it is needed.

The ritual for Anointing of the Sick does also include special prayers and blessings for those who are facing death, including viaticum (communion given to the dying, trusting that the Lord Jesus will be their companion along the way, as they make their final journey).

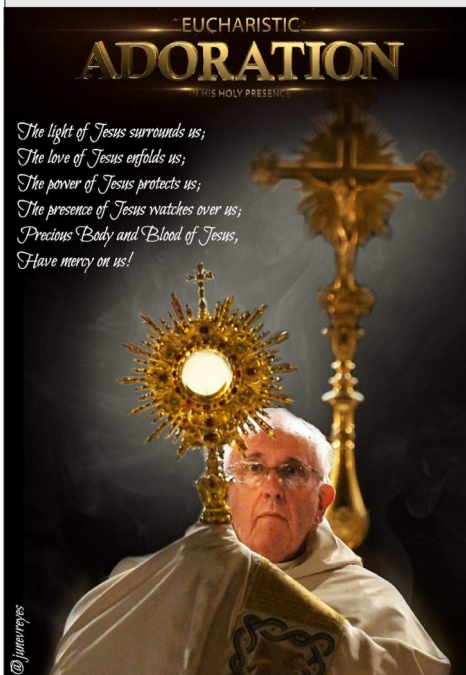

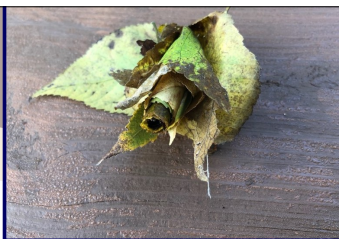

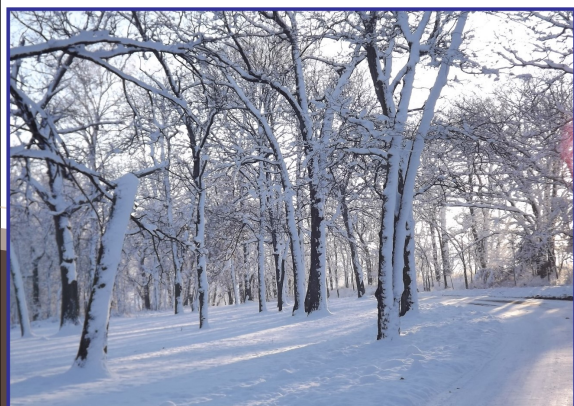
