



WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Question: I have a friend who receives communion, but who I know for a fact is in a state of mortal sin. Should I tell our priest? Is it my responsibility to say something?

Answer: While we may always want to do what is best for our friends and family members, we have a responsibility to respect their privacy and their conscience. In its reflections on the Eighth Commandment ("You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor"), the Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "Respect for the reputation of persons forbids every attitude and word likely to cause them unjust injury. [One] becomes guilt: -of rash judgment who, even tacitly, assumes as true, without sufficient foundation, the moral fault of a neighbor; -of detraction who, without objectively valid reason, discloses another's faults and failings to persons who do not know them; of calumny who, by remarks contrary to the truth, harms the reputation of others and gives occasion for false judgments concerning them" (no. 2477). We will never truly know what is in a person's mind, heart, and soul; only God knows those things. We should, of course, take our concerns to God and entrust the person about whom we are concerned to God's grace and mercy. If we have concerns about the spiritual wellbeing of someone with whom we are close, we should go to the person themselves and talk about our fears and concerns. Unless it is a case of abuse or endangerment (which we have a moral and even legal responsibility to report to the appropriate authorities), we ultimately do not have the freedom to share another's persons faults or sins, however good we think our intentions might be. ©LPi

FAITH

St. Stephen the Martyr is proud of its unique identity as a faith-based Catholic school. Our education develops knowledgeable Christian servant leaders to impact the world. We invoke God's name in prayer first thing in the morning, throughout the day and upon dismissal. Each class attends Mass and assists in the liturgies. Students are active in Catholic devotions including praying the Rosary, Eucharistic Adoration, and The Stations of the Cross. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is offered to students throughout the school year. Our priests regularly visit classrooms and help with faith formation.

Our preschool programs participate in Montessori-based approach to faith formation through the "Catechesis of the Good Shepherd" curriculum and the "Theology of the Body" curriculum is used for faith formation in grades K-8.

Our Catholic Identity Committee meets quarterly to review Catholic Identity goals. In 2023, the committee planned and facilitated our first school-wide Eucharistic Procession, our annual May Crowning procession, and student-led Lent and Advent prayer services. Additionally, the committee plans and facilitates 24 hours of faith formation for our teachers each year.

COMMUNITY

A sense of community is fostered between grade levels with our buddy reading program and mixed-grade Mass celebrations. Students have the opportunity to participate in athletics including basketball, football, volleyball, cross country, track, and soccer through the Parochial Athletic League (PAL) and Catholic Youth Soccer League (CYSL). We also offer an array of extracurricular opportunities including robotics, musicals, math club, yearbook committee, student council, band, SSM News Team, and more.

As part of the curriculum, students grow in virtue by participating in community outreach starting in preschool. Students feed the hungry with food drives, make cards and gifts for the homebound, elderly, and sick, provide warmth to the homeless and low-income hosting sock and winter glove drives, and support women and children through our participation in our parish's annual diaper drive and our school's annual Penny War benefitting Essential Pregnancy Services.

Parents are encouraged to play an active role in their child's education by collaborating with teachers, volunteering in the classroom, and getting to know other parents. A vibrant and active Home & School Association plans many events for parents to interact and create lasting friendships.

OUR STORY


St. Stephen the Martyr Catholic School was established in 1992 and named after the first martyr of the Catholic Church. The school started with grades K-5. Fr. Gerry Gonderinger was the founding pastor and Sister Regina Wagner was the first principal. Our own Fr. Dave Belt was the first music teacher in addition to being the associate pastor. Within four years of opening the school, it had grown to K-8th grade. Two years later a new structure was added providing 19 more classrooms, a computer lab, a library, and a full-size, state-of-the-art gym. The enrollment grew quickly and by 2002, there were three classes in every grade including preschool.

In 2008, the school earned the title of being a National Blue Ribbon School. That same year, St. Stephen the Martyr became an accredited school. Both awards acknowledge excellence in administration, curriculum, and instructional staff. The school continues to exceed accreditation standards attributable to the hard work and commitment of students, staff, and families. St. Stephen the Martyr Catholic School is truly a place where students, staff, and families feel safe and loved.

Today St. Stephen the Martyr Catholic School has 701 students enrolled in preschool through 8th grade and consistently remains a top-five populated Catholic Elementary School in Nebraska. Since its inception, St. Stephen the Martyr has graduated almost 2,000 students.

We are so grateful to our families for their outpouring of support and confidence in our school leadership. Everything we do together, and we will continue to provide students with an exceptional faith-filled education.

LEARNING

St. Stephen follows the State of Nebraska curriculum standards while adding additional Archdiocesan curriculum standards, including religion and more robust core expectations. Our academic programs are measured against performance objectives and are aligned with The National Standards and Benchmarks For Effective Catholic Elementary Schools. Our students are assessed three times during the school year in both reading and math using Renaissance® STAR™ Assessments. These assessments allow teachers to pinpoint exactly where a student's abilities are at a given time, while also charting their progress and allowing teachers to tailor learning and standards to their students' level and abilities. Additionally, teachers can collaborate with their colleagues to understand incoming and outgoing students' abilities and together help students not only meet required standards but exceed standards when possible. The charts on the left show comparative information from winter 2024 data based on the national average and St. Stephen the Martyr Catholic School.

St. Stephen the Martyr offers a Blended Learning approach to education. Students in a Blended Learning classroom rotate through small group stations to better understand specific concepts within a core subject (i.e. multiplication). Examples of small groups would include manipulatives, teacher (small group), reading/writing (cross-curricular), and iPad/computer work. This also allows teachers to differentiate learning by placing students into groups based on their level of understanding.

We are a Google-based educational facility and utilize Google Classroom Suite for posting assignments, calendars and email communications. Our technology lab includes Google Chromebooks, iPads, 3D printers, robots and a STEM maker space. Additionally, each of 6-8th grade students has their own Chromebook through our rent-to-own program. TK-5th grade classrooms have a shared set of iPads. Teachers have access to their own iPad and laptop to use with either an interactive board or an Apple TV for projection or board work. The school also uses many digital learning opportunities through RAZ Kids, Mystery Science, Freckle Math & ELA, Flocabulary, IXL, guided readers, BrainPop, and other grade-specific subscriptions. The school currently uses FACTS School Information System, and Home & School funds a customized family mobile app that allows our families to easily access their FACTS Family Portal and other school resources.

At St. Stephen, learning extends beyond our students. In addition to 24 hours of faith formation, our teachers participate in 20 hours of professional development sessions on curriculum alignment, data analysis, and MTSS (multi-tiered system of supports) strategies for a growth mindset and social-emotional learning. For the best behavioral and academic outcomes for our students, we use the Gradual Release of Responsibility Framework, an "I do, We do, You do" approach to learning and Positive Behavior Interventions & Supports (PBIS). Additionally, we use Restorative Practices to promote inclusiveness. relationship-building, and problem-solving. Instead of punishing students, we encourage students to reflect on and take responsibility for their actions and then build plans to repair any harm they may have caused. The way students are treated, and the way students treat others is just as important in a Catholic school as the formal, written curriculum.

"When our oldest started preschool, we remember walking into the school and her teacher said, "Isn't it amazing that God blessed us with this beautiful weather?" 2023 HIGHLIGHTS

- In the 2023-2024 school year we welcomed 113 new students and 53 new school families, bringing our Preschool-8th grade enrollment to 701.
- Our Resource Team has two full-time resource teachers, two interventionists, two counselors, three teacherassociates and a dedicated volunteer who support our classroom teachers and students to ensure every child is successful in school. This multi-tiered system of support, provides a proactive and preventative framework, integrating data and instruction to maximize student achievement and support their social, emotional, and behavioral needs from a strengths-based perspective, educating the whole child.
- Digital curriculum subscriptions including RAZ Kids, Mystery Science, Freckle Math, Freckle ELA, IXL and other grade-specific subscriptions were renewed to supplement in-school instruction and learning assessments.
- School facility updates include handicap-accessible entrance doors, school office remodel, new carpet in kinder classrooms, new viny tile in science labs, updated heating and cooling control system for room-by-room temp control, replaced school offices' AC unit, kitchen updates (new dishwasher, ovens, lunch trays) and new door handles/locks for all classrooms.
- Home & School Association raised \$147,557.62 for our school. These funds help offset instructional expenses and fund necessary remodels and security upgrades.
- Our students supported our community through wholeschool and class-level service projects including food drives, collections (socks, diapers, winter gloves and hats, financial donations, etc.), visiting the elderly and homebound during the holidays and much more!



Live The Liturgy Inspiration of the Week

With one swift command, Jesus freed a man from the possession of evil spirits. He has that same power to banish the shadow of sin from our own lives. Let's invite him into our hearts, asking him to cleanse the darkness he finds there.
