




## THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." - Mt 2:1-2

## Pastor's Message—From Father Dave

"And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother.

The Gospel on this Feast of the Epiphany is a dramatic story of a journey begun in faith. Three astrologers



The journey of the Magi is our journey too. Every step in our life we take in faith. We don't know what we are going to find in this journey and we don't know for sure how God will reveal Himself to us. What we do know is that God will certainly lead us, if we only let Him. Many times we are reluctant to entrust ourselves completely to God. We would rather find our own way instead of following the path that God has prepared for us. But when we try to find our own way, we are going to get lost and discouraged. When we try to go on our own, we do not experience the Light of Jesus Christ.

The Magi teach us today that we must walk by faith. When we experience the presence of Jesus Christ, we must then go back out into the world to share His light and love with the people around us. Let us pray that we may be like the Magi, who made their journey in faith, experienced the newborn King, offered their gifts, and returned to their homeland, changed by their journey.

Epiphany Home Blessing

The Epiphany of the Lord is a traditional day to welcome Christ into your home in the New Year 20 + C + M + B + 24 by blessing it. To bless your home on Epiphany, write the letters C, M and B and the numbers of the year at the top of your door. The letters

stand for the names of the three Magi: Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar. They also represent the Latin blessing *Christus mansionem benedicat*, which means "May Christ bless this house." It should be written above a main doorway, preferably on the lintel, and look like this: 20 C+M+B 24.



# An Explanation of the Forty Hours Devotion from Fr. Zach Tucker

What is the "Forty Hours Devotion?" The Forty Hours Devotion is 40 hours of perpetual adoration. Forty Hours has been part of the parish life of the Church for well over 500 years. It flourished under the promotion of saints like St. Charles Borromeo, St. Anthony Maria Zaccaria, St. Ignatius of Loyola, St. Francis de Sales, St. Philip Neri, St. John Neumann and many others. In 16th century Milan, Italy, Eucharistic adoration would move from church to church every 40 hours, with parishes working together to keep the devotion running throughout the entire year.

In the Middle Ages it was celebrated as period of intense supplication in times of crisis; during the Catholic Counter-Reformation, as an effort at the renewal of popular devotion; in 19th-century America, as a way of unifying persecuted Catholics. In our own day, in the midst of our own particular struggles and sufferings, as well as our joys and successes, it is once again an opportunity to spend time with Our Lord, present Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity in the Eucharist.

But why 40 hours as a timeframe in particular? Well, Sacred Scripture gives us repeated symbolic instances of the number: Moses' years in Egypt, the years the Israelites wandered in the desert, the days of Jonah's preaching in Nineveh, Jesus' days of fasting in the desert and many more. We spend 40 days in prayer, fasting and almsgiving during Lent. Most importantly, from the Crucifixion on the afternoon of Good Friday to the Resurrection on Easter morning, Our Lord lay in the tomb for roughly 40 hours.

Those 40 years in the desert were an opportunity for the Israelites to be purified and strengthened in faith. Jonah spent weeks pleading with the Ninevites to lay aside their sins and turn to God. Jesus' own fasting prepared him to go out and bring souls to the Father, calling them to conversion. His Death and Resurrection opened the door to salvation for us, as well as to an ongoing personal relationship with the God who loves us.

This is exactly what the Forty Hours Devotion offers. In every era, in every culture with its own ups and downs, Christ comes in the Eucharist to be the heart of our communities. Made humble upon the altar, He invites us to bring our troubled souls to Him, and through Him to the Father, to receive comfort, consolation, and strength.

# WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

**Question:** What is Eucharistic Adoration?

**Answer:** The practice of Eucharistic Adoration is a centuries old ritual and falls within a broader category of devotions and rituals that are associated with the Sacrament of the Eucharist. In a particular way, Eucharistic Adoration is an extension of the worship and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament that occurs in every Mass.


In a long-standing practice, a period of Eucharistic Adoration often ends with "benediction," the blessing of the faith with the Blessed Sacrament.

Several parishes throughout the United States have introduced the practice of perpetual Eucharistic Adoration, while other communities have the custom of shorter periods of Eucharistic Adoration. Care should always be taken that these periods of adoration respect the instructions outlined in Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharist Outside of Mass, the liturgical book that gives the instructions for the proper celebration of Eucharistic Adoration.

Although adoration of the Blessed Sacrament can never take the place of Eucharistic Communion, many Catholics find great comfort and consolation in their prayers before the Eucharist enshrined in the tabernacle or when it is exposed in the monstrance (both are equally valid, as the Christ is not more present in one than in the other). But when we consider our eucharistic devotions, it is always important to remember the fundamental connection these acts of devotion have the celebration of the Eucharist in the Mass and reception of Christ in Communion. **©LPi**






