

Pastor's Message—From Father Dave

I would like to use my column this week to address some questions that we have had regarding Mass Intentions. As you know from reading the bulletin and attending Mass here at Saint Stephen, there has been a tradition of publishing/announcing what the intention is for each Mass. While there is no plan to change this practice, I want to clarify what Mass intentions are and the current Church laws that direct this ancient practice of "having a Mass said" for a particular intention.

Mass intentions and stipends have a very long and complicated history in our Church. They have their roots in the 7th and 8th centuries, when donors were paying an honorarium to the priest before the liturgy with the expectation that the Mass would be celebrated only for the intention that was specified by the donor. As the Mass became more exclusive and the participation of the assembly during Mass was minimized or even eliminated, Mass stipends became one of the few ways in which lay people could still have a role in the liturgy. By making an offering to the priest they were assured that their individual, special intentions would be remembered at the Mass.

With the liturgical reforms following Vatican II, there is no longer any real need for this kind of participation. Every member of the congregation has ample opportunity to participate in Mass through prayer, song, and gesture. There was also a shift in the Church's understanding of the donation given to the priest in the 1983 revision of Church Law (The Code of Canon Law), which rejects the terminology of "stipend" and speaks of an "offering." For centuries, the Mass stipend was seen as compensation for the priest's time and labor, but the revised Code speaks of the Mass offering, which better conveys the freewill, gratuitous nature of a gift. A Mass offering is seen as a gift to the Church for the support of its ministers and not as a contract involving services in return for the payment of money. When an individual makes a donation, it becomes the obligation of the priest only to exclusively celebrate the Mass for the intention of the donor. By accepting a Mass offering, the only obligation that the priest undertakes is to celebrate Mass at some time for the particular intention: there is no obligation to publish or announce the intention for Mass.

After this brief historical and theological background, the practice of offering a monetary gift for a Mass intention can be summarized in one sentence: The intention for which an offering is given becomes the priest's intention only, not the intention of the entire congregation. While a donor appreciates hearing his/her intention announced at Mass, in no way does it diminish the importance of the prayers and intentions of the rest of the congregation.

Please note also that the pastor of a parish is bound by Church Law to celebrate one Mass per weekend and on Holy Days of Obligation for the people of the parish (*missa pro populo*). The associate pastor or a substitute priest is not allowed to celebrate the *pro populo* Mass, unless there is a serious reason. Because the priests' schedules may have to be altered at the last minute, there may also be a last-minute change in the Mass intentions, so that I may fulfill my obligation to celebrate one Mass a week and on Holy Days of Obligation for the people of the parish. Also, there are times during the week when the priest who is scheduled for Mass has a last-minute conflict, and a deacon must step in to conduct a Communion Service. Whenever possible, in these situations, someone from the parish office will contact the donor to inform them of the change. If this does happen, the Mass intention will be scheduled for another day. The priests and parish office staff are grateful for your patience and understanding when these changes are necessary.

Finally, per Archdiocesan policy, the suggested offering for Mass in the Archdiocese of Omaha is \$10. Also, if a priest says more than one Mass a day, he can only accept an offering for one Mass (except for Christmas). According to Archdiocesan policy, the rest of the offerings are sent once a month to the Chancery and placed in the Seminary Trust Fund.



The Future of Youth & Young Adult Ministry at our Parish

A Message from Adam Ybarra, Director of Mission

In October of this past year, Evan Collins resigned from his position as the Director of Youth and Young Adult Ministry here at St. Stephen's to pursue other ministry opportunities. Although his time here was short-lived, the impact that he had on the youth and young adults of our parish family was incredible. Subsequently, his departure has also left us with a very large hole that we have needed to fill on our staff. After hosting several applicants for interviews, we haven't been able to find a qualified applicant and have decided to temporarily postpone the hiring process.

As God's providence would have it (and with some foresight from Evan) we still have robust programming being offered for the and young adults of our parish. Here's how it will look for the spring semester:

Young Adult Ministry: Our parish has been in collaboration with young adult leaders from our parish family, namely St. Wenceslaus and St. Vincent de Paul, to provide programming and support for our parishes. St. Stephen's is being represented by Fr. Zach Tucker and Adam Ybarra. This group meets monthly to pray and to discuss future events.

Youth Ministry: St. Stephen's has been collaborating with the youth minister from St. Wenceslaus to provide on-going programming and support for our parish youth. There is a rotating schedule of weekly events that are being hosted between our two parishes. We will also be joining efforts for our summer events – Totus Tuus and Steubenville of Rochester (different location from last year). We have asked Mr. Terry Wenzl from our school to take the lead on providing four annual events that will be designed to meet the needs of our middle school students.

During this time, we will continue to assess the staffing needs here at the parish. If you know of a potential applicant, please let me know and please continue to pray for the efforts of youth and young adult ministry here in the parish and the archdiocese.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Question: Is gossip a mortal sin?

Answer: To really ask this question, we must consider the Eighth Commandment: "You shall not bear false witness."

In its reflections on this commandment, The Catechism of the Catholic Church invites us to not only think about what bearing "false witness" means, but to also consider how we understand the truth and how we communicate more broadly. This is why so much of this section of the Catechism has to do with the gift of language. With this in mind, we will notice that the word "gossip" isn't used by the Catechism. Instead, we find the words "detraction" and "calumny," which are actually two forms that gossip can take, and both can be quite serious.

First, detraction is the of revealing "another's faults and failings to persons who did not know them," without morally valid reasons. Calumny, by extension, is saying something about another person that is untrue, and it is sinful because it "harms the reputation of others and gives occasion for false judgements" (see no. 2477). In all of our communication, we have to always recognize that we have a moral obligation to the truth and to always work to protect the reputation and honor of our neighbors (see no. 2479). Gossip can, in fact, prove to be a very serious sin. After all, the Catechism reminds us: "No one is bound to reveal the truth to someone who does not have the right to know it" (no. 2489). When we have gossiped, especially if we are aware we have damaged another person's good name or reputation, we want to make every effort to undo the damage we have done, including seeking the grace and forgiveness offered in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. ©LPi
