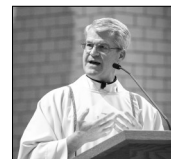

## Pastor's Message—From Father Dave

**"They are filled with every form of wickedness, evil, greed, and malice; full of envy, murder, rivalry, treachery, and spite. They are gossips and scandalmongers and they hate God. They are insolent, haughty, boastful, ingenious in the wickedness, and rebellious toward their parents. They are senseless, faithless, heartless, ruthless. Although they know the just decree of God that all who practice such things deserve death, they not only practice them but give approval to those who practice them."** -Romans 1:29-32



I am taking up an unpopular topic this week—sin. It seems to me that we have lost all understanding of what sin is and how it permeates our lives and society as a whole. We have been brainwashed by modern society into believing that we don't have to take responsibility for our sinful acts or that our sins can be explained away. We have so many shows on television, in movie theaters and online that are so full of immoral sexual activity, violence, and lack of respect for human life that we come to believe that all of this is somehow acceptable. The tragedy of sin, however, is truly present in our life today. Even though we try to explain our sinful attitudes and actions away; even though we try to blame others for our lack of faithfulness to God, the bottom line is that we will be held accountable for the quality of our moral choices and the way that we live our life in relationship to God and His people.

So, what is sin? Do all sins have the same seriousness or are there greater and lesser sins? In order to answer questions about sin, I am going to quote directly from the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

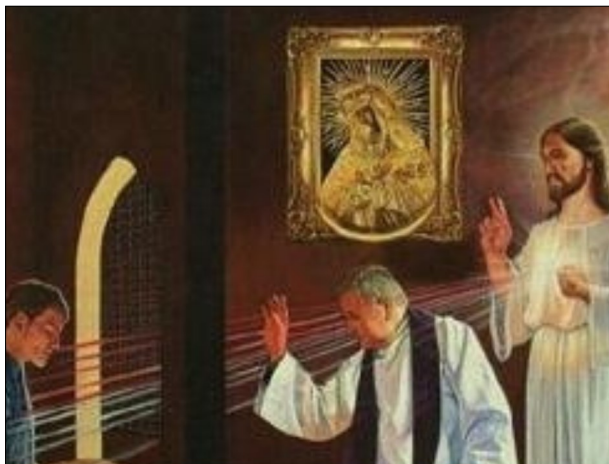
The Catechism states, "Sin is an offense against God: 'Against you, you alone, have I sinned, and done that which is evil in your sight (Psalm 51:4).' Sin sets itself against God's love for us and turns our hearts away from it. Like the first sin, it is disobedience, a revolt against God through the will to become 'like gods,' knowing and determining good and evil. Sin is thus 'love of oneself even to contempt of God'" Catechism #1850.

The Church teaches that there are different degrees of sin. Some sins break our friendship with God and the Church, and some sins injure our relationship with God and the Church. Those sins that break our friendship with God and others are what the Church calls grave or mortal sins. The Catechism states that, "Mortal sin destroys charity in the heart of man by a grave violation of God's law; it turns man away from God, who is his ultimate end and his beatitude, by preferring an inferior good to him..." Catechism # 1855. "For a sin to be mortal, three conditions must together be met: 'Mortal sin is sin whose object is grave matter and which is also committed with full knowledge and deliberate consent...' " Catechism # 1857. "Grave matter is specified by the Ten Commandments, corresponding to the answer of Jesus to the rich young man (Mark 10:19)" Catechism # 1858.

Mortal sins would be those violations of God's law, such as murder, adultery, fornication, theft, slander, lying, anger, impurity, selfishness, etc., that completely break our relationship with God and his people. Probably the most common mortal sin committed in the Church today is that of not going to Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. When an individual is living in the state of mortal sin, he is not to receive Holy Communion until he has celebrated the Sacrament of Reconciliation. By his mortal sin, he has broken his communion with God and with the Church: Sacramental Confession can only restore it. Through the Catechism, the Church also teaches that, "If it (mortal sin) is not redeemed by repentance and God's forgiveness, it causes exclusion from Christ's kingdom and the eternal death of hell, for our freedom has the power to make choices forever, with no turning back. However, although we can judge that an act is in itself a grave offense, we must entrust judgment of persons to the justice and mercy of God" Catechism # 1861.

**Venial** sins are those sins that injure our friendship with God and others, but do not destroy the relationship. The Catechism teaches that, "Venial sin weakens charity; it manifests a disordered affection for created goods; it impedes the soul's progress in the exercise of the virtues and the practice of the moral good; it merits temporal punishment. Deliberate and unrepented venial sin disposes us little by little to commit mortal sin..." Catechism #1863.

## Pastor's Message—From Father Dave (continued from page 1)

Before we approach the Lord in the Sacrament of Penance, it's important to be prepared for this encounter. The Church teaches that 4 elements must be present to make it a valid Confession:

- 1) Contrition: Real sorrow for our sins is the fundamental aspect of the Sacrament.
- 2) A desire to amend one's life, or "firm purpose of amendment." Sometimes people fall into a mentality that they don't really need to try to amend or reform their life. "If we sin, we can just go to Confession again." Overly frequent Confession could indicate that a person has fallen into the sin of presumption of God's mercy and perhaps a weakened resolve not to sin again. Going to Confession without this "firm purpose of amendment" may be an abuse of the Sacrament.
- 3) Confession of Sins: I'll share more information next week.
- 4) The intention of performing the penance assigned by the priest.

In preparing ourselves to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation, the Church calls us to make a diligent examination of conscience. Before we approach Jesus in the Sacrament, we must first pray about the areas in our life that need His healing grace. There are many resources available that serve as guides for an examination of conscience. Many booklets, guides, and online resources are based on the 10 Commandments, the Beatitudes, the 7 deadly sins, the Precepts of the Church, etc. An examination of conscience is an instrument to help us get honest with ourselves so that we may be honest with the priest/confessor in Reconciliation, and thus receive the fullness of God's grace through penance and absolution.

Next week: How to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

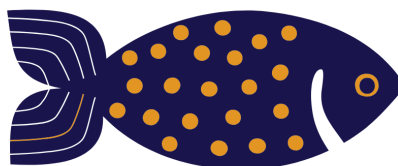

The Stations of the Cross, also known as the Way of the Cross or Via Crucis, commemorate Jesus' passion and death on the cross. There are 14 stations that each depict a moment on his journey to Calvary.

## WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

**Question:** What's the difference between priests, brothers, friars, etc.?

**Answer:** The distinctions titles and categories used for priests and the male members of religious communities can be confusing, especially since the categories can sometimes be intertwined as a man can be both a priest and a monk, or a brother and a friar. So, to help to piece the puzzle together, it's important to begin by noting some basic distinctions. The distinction between priests (who are ordained for sacramental ministry) and brothers (who are non-ordained members of religious communities and who are committed to lives of prayer and service).

**Priests:** A priest is a man who has been ordained for sacramental ministry and these fall into two categories: A) Diocesan (or Secular) Priests can either be attached to a diocese and who serve under a bishop. Their ministry is usually oriented toward pastoral service. B) Religious Priests are members of religious communities (like the Franciscans, Jesuits, Salvatorians, or Carmelites) and their lives are guided by the special mission and charism of their community. While both kinds of priest practice sacramental ministry, their spirituality and how they live out their priesthood can be very different.

**Brothers:** Brothers are non-ordained members of religious communities (such as those mentioned above) who live lives committed to prayer and service. Religious priests and brothers serve together in their communities and their ministries include much more than the care of parishes.

**Monks, Friars, and Canons:** These are broad categories that include religious priests and brothers, and each of these is connected to specific ways of life and spiritualities. ©LPi
