## 5<sup>™</sup> SUNDAY OF LENT

Jesus told her, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live." - Jn 11:25

### Pastor's Message—From Father Dave

"Then the Father said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. But we had to celebrate and rejoice, because this brother of yours was dead and has come to life; he was lost and has been found."" -Luke 15:32

This concluding sentence from the well-known story of the Prodigal Son does a great job of summarizing why we celebrate the Sacrament of Penance. Through the process of conversion, we realize that we have sinned against God and His Church, and our only desire is to come back to full unity with Him and His people. The Church gives us three different rites for coming back to God the Father in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The first is the *Order for Reconciling Individual Penitents*; the second is the *Order for Reconciling Several Penitents with Individual Confession and Absolution*; the third is the *Order for Reconciling Several Penitents with General Confession and Absolution*. Confession and Absolution. The first two rites are those that are normally celebrated in the life of the Church and the third rite is reserved for exceptional circumstances where there is "grave need".

The Order for Reconciling Individual Penitents takes place with a priest and a penitent. Even though there are only two people involved, this is still considered a communal act of worship, since the priest is the representative of the Church, and the penitent is a member of the larger Body of Christ. This form begins with a greeting by the priest and the sign of the cross. Next comes the confession of sins and the acceptance of the penance given by the priest, followed by the penitent praying the *Act of Contrition*. Finally, the priest offers the prayer of absolution, and a brief

The Order for Reconciling Several Penitents with Individual Confession and Absolution is that of a group of penitents gathered with individual confession and absolution of sins. The Church teaches that the communal celebration (what we offer as a "Penance Service" during Advent and Lent) "shows more clearly the ecclesial nature of penance. Celebrating the Sacrament of Penance in a communal setting, centered on God's Word proclaimed in Scripture, is the most appropriate manner for us to experience the gift of healing in our own personal lives and in the life of the parish and the greater Church." In this celebration, the community gathers to listen to the word of God, which proclaims His mercy and invites them to conversion. At the conclusion of the Liturgy of the Word, the community then prays a litany or is led through a brief examination of conscience. The Rite of Reconciliation begins with a general confession of sins. This is usually the *Confesior* that we pray together at the beginning of Mass. The Lord's Prayer is said together, and the penitents then go to the stations where the priests will hear individual confessions. The form will follow that of Reconciling Individual Penitents, except that the Act of Contrition is not prayed (we prayed it together).

### **Celebrating the Sacrament of Penance in 12 Steps**

- Prepare to celebrate the Sacrament by examining your conscience. Please consider writing notes to help you remember what you want to confess.
- The Priest will welcome you. Don't be afraid. We're here to serve in the person of Christ. Our work is to offer the mercy and peace of Jesus.
- Make the sign of the cross. Say these or similar words: "Bless me Father for I have sinned. It has been \_\_\_\_\_ (weeks, months, years) since my last Confession. These are my sins."
- Tell the priest your sins. The Church teaches that the penitent must confess "number and kind" of each sin. The confession of sin should be specific, concise and to the point. For example, saying, "I sinned against the Fourth Commandment," isn't specific enough. Name your sins. Say how many times you committed the sin. If you can't remember the exact number, give an estimate. On the other hand, there is no need to include all sorts of information around the circumstances of each sin. If the priest wants additional information, he will ask questions. Also, it is not necessary to confess sins from your past, unless you neglected to confess a mortal sin.
- Say these or similar words: "For these and all my sins, I am sorry."
- The priest may ask questions or offer a word of encouragement or guidance. Please note that Confession is not the time for in-depth spiritual direction or a place to ask for detailed advice on how to address a situation. If you need that kind of spiritual help, please make a separate appointment with the priest. (continued on page 2)



Express your sorrow for your sins through praying an Act of Contrition. This has already been done together if you are participating in a Penance Service.

Receive God's forgiveness as the priest prays the Prayer of Absolution.
Give praise to God, as the priest says something like, "Go in peace" ("Thanks be to God!"), or "Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good," (For his mercy endures forever!").

Perform your penance.

Amend your life. Remember that a "firm purpose of amendment" is a part of validly receiving the Sacrament. Celebrating the Sacrament of Penance is the easy part. The difficult part is actually changing our life, so we don't commit these sins again.

To conclude this four-week series of articles on sin and forgiveness, I encourage you to make some time in the last days of Lent to examine your own lives and to recognize how you have harmed or broken your relationship with God and His Church. I also strongly encourage you to approach the Sacrament of Penance, either in our parish Penance Service on Tuesday evening, March 19th, or in our scheduled times for individual confession. You can find these dates and times in our bulletin, and on our website. Also note that we have confession guides available on the Welcome Table in the Gathering Space, in the brochure rack near the parish office door, and on the stand between the Reconciliation Room doors. We have distributed several thousand of these over the last few years, and just ordered 1,000 more.

# Eucharistic Miracles of the World

### March 9th- March 20th | Gathering Space

St. Stephen is hosting the Vatican-approved international Eucharistic Miracles of the World exhibit from March 9th - March 20th in the Gathering Space. The Eucharistic Miracles of the World exhibit is a traveling display on loan from Spirit Catholic Radio and is free to view. ## WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

**Question:** Why do parishes have the Blessed Sacrament in a separate room?

Answer: While many Catholics of a certain age have memories of the Blessed Sacrament being housed in the tabernacle on the high altar of the church, many parishes in the decades since the Second Vatican Council have chosen to build a separate space — a reservation chapel — where the Blessed Sacrament is kept. Although this practice is not universal, it is in keeping with the guidance offered by the US Bishops in their document Built of Living Stones (see nos 77-78). The goal is to create a space that is separated from the nave and sanctuary, but which is "integrally connected with the church" which can foster "reverence and can provide the quiet and focus needed for personal prayer." This can be especially important for communities that have continuous eucharistic adoration, allowing people to come and pray in a space separate from the normal activities of parish life.

The practice of reserving the Eucharist in a separate space — or in a dignified location away from the altar where Mass is celebrated — is that it emphasizes the importance of the liturgy itself, which is the "source and summit" of the life of the Church.

As with many things in the Church, the practice of placing the tabernacle in the sanctuary or in a separate chapel is not universal (as can be seen in visits to historic churches in Rome and other places). The important thing is that as communities question where to place the tabernacle, they listen to the voice of the Church, explore the ancient and varied liturgical tradition of the Church, consider the needs and life of the community, and also take into account the architecture and limits of the spaces they might already have.


