



Pastor's Message—From Father Dave

"Why are you troubled? And why do questions arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have."

The appearance of Jesus in the locked upper room would have been a frightening experience, but it is more than just a dead man among them that startles the apostles. The evidence of the crucifixion verifies that it is indeed Jesus Christ risen from the dead.

The disciples were locked in that room because they were afraid of the civil and religious leaders. They were associated with the criminal who was put to death, and they feared for their own lives. But could it be that they were also afraid because they were responsible for the wounds in our Lord's hands and feet? When Jesus needed their support and their strength, they abandoned Him, betrayed Him, and denied Him. They had plenty of reasons to be afraid; yet Jesus greets them warmly by saying, "Peace be with you." Then He asks to share a meal with them, an act of humble intimacy.

Because of our sins and our failures, we are responsible for the wounds of Christ, crucified for us. But the good news is that He comes to us, He forgives us, and He offers us the gift of peace. This profound gift of Christ's presence comes to us in the Eucharist, which draws us all together on Sunday, the day of His resurrection. Let us give thanks for the abundant gift of peace and forgiveness which Jesus shares with us.






Vocation Series Offered at St. Vincent de Paul

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Question: Where did the feast of Divine Mercy come from?

Answer:

If you were born well before the year 2000, you know the feast of Divine Mercy has not always been celebrated in the Church. In the early 1900s, a young Polish nun began receiving private revelations. Jesus appeared to her during her times of prayer, speaking a message of mercy and love for the world. She received a set of prayers the Divine Mercy Chaplet — and the request to have a feast day established to remind the Church of the mercy of God. St. Faustina died in 1938, on the cusp of war and in the midst of one of the most violent centuries in the history of the world.

Her story and her diaries began circulating in Poland and beyond. It quickly became apparent that this was a holy young women, and the cause for her canonization opened. In the year 2000, she was canonized by the first-ever Polish pope, St. John Paul II. On her canonization day, he established the second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday, "a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind with experience in the years to come." ©LPi


