"Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me." - Jn 6:56-57

Pastor's Message—From Father Dave

"Jesus said to them, 'Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day.""



There are some tribes in Africa that share the custom where two friends make a small cut in the flesh of the other person, just above the heart, to draw blood. The friends then intermingle their blood to symbolize that they are now a part of each other's flesh and blood and will also share in each other's pain.

Jesus Christ has given us the gift of His blood, and through His suffering and death on the cross, He shares our own pain and suffering. Catholic theologian Karl Rahner once wrote, "Jesus gives us His flesh because we do not often know how to come to Him. He is never far away. Jesus becomes touchable and tangible." Isn't it comforting to know that, when we are lost and do not know the way back to Jesus, He comes to find us? When we gather to celebrate the Eucharist, Jesus comes to us, and His pain touches our pain. In this moment we are healed, and we are united always and forever by a flesh-and-blood bond that can never be broken.

We taste sacrifice and love in the Eucharist. Just as Jesus gave His flesh for food and blood for drink, this Communion with Christ can transform us to do God's work in the world. Jesus gave His very life for us, and we are sent to do the same for others.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Question: I've heard that gratitude is a fruit of the Holy Spirit. What does that mean?

Answer: In St. Paul's letter to the Galatians, he talks about the "fruits of the Holy Spirit." He is referencing an idea that Jesus talks about frequently in the Gospels. "By their fruits you will know them" (Matthew 7:16). He uses the example of a plant. If the plant is healthy, it will bear good fruit. If the plant is unhealthy, it will bear rotten fruit or none at all. Jesus echoes this idea at the Last Supper, when he says that if we remain close to him we will "bear much fruit" (John 15:8). If we allow the Holy Spirit to work in our lives, we will bear the fruits of the Spirit!

Technically, gratitude is not one of the fruits St. Paul lists. "The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control" (Galatians 5:22-23). But doesn't that sound like the response of a grateful heart? When we're grateful, we experience a sense of joy and peace that makes it easier to love. We can be kind, patient, generous, and gentle with others rather than possessive or competitive. When we're grateful, we don't need to grasp at what we don't have. We practice self-control. Gratitude helps us to be faithful, knowing God will always be with us. Sounds like good fruit to me! ©LPi
