

Pastor's Message — From Father Dave

"Since the children share in the blood and flesh, Jesus likewise shared in them, that through death he might destroy the one who has the power of death... and free those who through fear of death had been subject to slavery all their life."



This Sunday's Feast of the Presentation of the Lord celebrates the 40th day since Christmas and, in the older liturgical books of the Church, it signaled the end of the Christmas season. But the readings for this feast do not give us a cozy "Baby-in-the-manger" message. Instead, the readings focus on death.

In the Gospel, the old man Simeon says that he can die in peace, since he has seen the Messiah. It seems that Simeon is welcoming death, and is looking forward to the day that he will be united with God in heaven. This is a change in the attitude of those who lived in the ancient world, since they believed that death was the end of life, not the goal of life. So a mortal human would do everything to avoid death and stay alive.

To the author of the Letter to the Hebrews, this "fear of death" translated into a kind of "slavery" to the power of death. But through embracing humanity and actually experiencing suffering and death, Jesus broke the chains of slavery to death, that nothing would ever separate us from the love of God.

Christmas, like Easter, is about life, death, and resurrection. Jesus came into this world to die and to rise from the dead, so that we might know eternal life. With grateful hearts, let us come before the Lord to thank Him for sending us the gift of His Son, who embraced humanity and death to break the barrier between God and us.



Living out the Clear Path to Discipleship

A Message from Adam Ybarra, Director of Mission

In October of 2020, Archbishop Lucas unveiled what he was calling "The Big Goal". The hope and directive would be that all parishes in the Archdiocese would become missional communities by 2026. These communities would be characterized and identified as having a focus on collaborative leadership, a culture of generosity and a clear path of discipleship.

Last fall, we had an expose on what collaborative leadership and a culture of generosity looked like here at St. Stephen through the actions of a few parishioners. Our last area of work is building a Clear Path of Discipleship. In essence, how are we as a parish equipping people to become disciples of Jesus Christ and thereby living out the Great Commission of Our Lord, "Go and make disciples of all nations..." (Matthew 28:19) This is the most definitive statement that He made.

In a parish of our size, it becomes doubly important that we are equipping people and helping to accompany them into a faithful AND fruitful relationship with Jesus. It can be very easy for people to fall through the cracks and feel to like they're doing this alone.

Through a great deal of discernment, advice, and work with a handful of parishioners, we have arrived at what our clear path of discipleship looks like here at St. Stephen. The clear path of discipleship looks like this: Welcome (Emmaus Neighborhood Outreach), Love (Parish Retreat), Faith (Small Groups), and Mission (Reach One More).

Practically speaking, a person is welcomed into a larger community and the life of that community. In that life, they are offered an opportunity to meet Jesus and have a first time (or new) conversion moment. From there, one begins to walk with fellow disciples in small group meetings or similar Bible studies where there is a deeper experience of their faith and to prepare for a life of mission where they are further equipped to share their faith with others.

Over the next couple of months, there will be a series of articles giving more understanding to how these are lived out. Remember, our goal is to help EVERYONE we meet know who Jesus Christ is and to know that He has a plan for their lives.

Our clear path is based on our mission statement AND the Eucharist – "the source and summit of all Christian life..." (CCC1324) as our foundation. There is the beautiful story in Luke's Gospel where we read about the Risen Christ appearing to the disciples on the road to Emmaus and how He encountered them. "...and how he was known to them in the breaking of the bread." (Luke 24:35)

This really is a special time in the life and history of St. Stephen the Martyr. We are growing, almost daily, and people across the city are hearing about the dynamic life that they are experiencing here within our community. Please pray for us, and each other, as we continue this important work.





WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Question: Luke's Gospel is the only one to mention the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple. What is Luke trying to communicate here and what connection does it have with Mary?

Answer: February 2 is exactly forty days after December 25, the nativity of Jesus. Jewish law (Ex 13:2, 12) dictated that Jesus, as the firstborn, be consecrated to God. This was done by the parents as they presented their Son in the Temple.

Jewish law further specified (Lv 12:2-8) that a mother was ritually impure after giving birth, and that she had to wait a set period of time (forty days for a boy) before she was to offer a sacrifice to the Lord for purification.

The convergence of these two Jewish regulations occasions Luke's account of both the Presentation of the Lord and the Purification of Mary. These days the liturgical emphasis is more on the Presentation of Jesus. Luke highlights the role of Simeon and Anna, two righteous Jews who recognized Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah and praised God for being able to see and experience such a marvel in their lifetimes.

Simeon's prayer concerning the special role of Jesus states that Jesus is "a light for revelation to the Gentiles." This phrase eventually originated the custom of blessing candles on this day which were to be used in the ceremonies, rituals, and processions throughout the church year. Thus February 2 is also known as Candlemas Day. This day is indeed a rich feast to be savored. ©LPi


