

July is the Month of the Precious Blood of Jesus

The month of July is dedicated to the Precious Blood. The feast of the Precious Blood of our Lord was instituted in 1849 by Pius IX, but the devotion is as old as Christianity. The early Fathers say that the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ, and that the sacraments were brought forth through His Blood. In 96 AD, Pope Clement said: "Let us fix our gaze on the Blood of Christ and realize how truly precious It is, seeing that it was poured out for our salvation and brought the grace of conversion to the whole world."



"Whatever town you enter and they welcome you, eat what is set before you, cure the sick in it and say to them, 'The kingdom of God is at hand for you." - Lk 10:8-9

Pastor's Message — From Father Dave

"The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest."

With these words Jesus is appointing seventy-two disciples, and he sends them in pairs to proclaim the Gospel to the world. As Jesus sends the seventy-two to spread the Good



As Jesus continues to call his disciples to go into the world, he teaches them that they will have a very difficult life ahead of them, but they must not bring any money, baggage, or sandals for their journey. They must only carry with them the knowledge of God's love and the peacefulness it brings. If they are faithful to their call, God will take care of them, and they will have nothing to worry about.

This is a good message for us to hear, because we can get shortsighted in our vision and our ministry. Jesus calls us to realize that we must have a broad vision of the needs of the entire world, not just the needs of those in our families or our parish. The Gospel of Jesus Christ must be spread throughout the world, and we are counted among those who have been called and chosen to do that work. Like the seventy-two, we are on a "mission trip" ourselves, and if we faithfully participate in our call to bring in the abundant harvest, we can be assured that our names will be written alongside theirs in heaven.





WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Question: As Catholics, we talk a lot about "redemptive suffering" and "carrying your cross." What does that mean practically in daily life?

Answer: When Jesus spoke these words, they would have sounded quite intense to his hearers. "Pick up your cross daily and follow me." At the time, Jesus hadn't yet been crucified. A cross was a Roman torture instrument. "Pick up the thing that tortures you the most," Jesus seemed to say. Unfortunately, most of us have no real shortage of these in our life. To take up the cross isn't to seek out new sufferings in our life. It's to accept the life we have.

Of course, unjust or unhealthy circumstances should be rectified when possible. But there are always circumstances that remain out of our immediate control. It could be pain management, the defiance of our teenage child, or an unhealthy work environment ... but you need the paycheck to pay the bills. In difficult circumstances, it can be easier to blame, complain, or daydream our way out of it. None of these are real solutions, since none of them accept the reality of the situation at hand. Those options only add to our suffering, since they damage relationships, fixate on the problem, or set up unrealistic expectations.

Instead, Jesus invites us to take up our cross — to look at the uncomfortable situation square in the eyes, take a deep breath, and do our best to be present to God's grace in the moment. To love those in our path. To take things one step at a time. ©LPi


