Pastor's Message — From Father Dave

"If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple."



Today's Gospel may seem harsh as we hear it. It seems too much to "hate" our parents, our family, and even our own life and our possessions. To understand what Jesus was teaching His followers—and teaching us today—we have to remember the context in which He was teaching. Jesus was making His way to Jerusalem and to the cross. He was going to be executed, and He knew that. He also knew that the crowds of people who were following Him had no clue where the road was leading. He stopped, turned around, and asked, "Do you really know what you are doing?"

The reality was that they were following Jesus for very different reasons. They wanted a change in their lives. There were those who were hungry who wanted to be fed; the sick, who wanted to be healed; the poor, who wanted to be rich; the dead, who, according to their relatives wanted to be revived. They all followed Him enthusiastically, because they believed that He would give them a better life. But Jesus turned on them and asked, "Are you willing to walk my way? Are you willing to pay the price for true happiness?" The people wanted to profit from knowing Jesus, to get more things, to get rich, to get healthy, and to get a sense of security in this world. They wanted a change in this life on earth.

What Jesus was offering was very different than what the crowds were expecting. They were thinking only of themselves and Jesus was only thinking about the Kingdom of God. Jesus tried to teach the throngs of people walking with Him that true fullness and happiness can only come if we empty ourselves in this life. Like Jesus, we must all place God and His Kingdom above everyone and everything else in this life.

Jesus wants a change in our lives too. Let us pray that we may have our sights set on the Kingdom of God, not on how we may profit in this life. Following Jesus means that we must always seek first the Kingdom of God, confident in God's promise that everything else will be given to us.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Question: What Happens if someone Drops a Consecrated Host?

Answer: Despite our best efforts, and this is as true in our liturgical celebrations as in all of life, accidents happen. Occasionally at Mass, a host may be dropped or some of the Precious Blood could even be spilled from the chalice, despite the best efforts of the priests, deacons, and extraordinary ministers of holy Communion assisting at the liturgy.

So, when a host is dropped or the Precious Blood is spilled, we can take guidance from the U.S. Bishops' statement Norms for the Distribution for Holy Communion Under Both Kinds:

All ministers of Holy Communion should show the greatest reverence for the Most Holy Eucharist by their demeanor, their attire, and the manner in which they handle the consecrated bread or wine. Should there be any mishap — as when, for example, the consecrated wine is spilled from the chalice — then the affected "area . . . should be washed with water, and this water should be then poured into the sacrarium."

According to no. 280 of the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, the general rule is that a dropped host is picked up by the minister distributing Communion and reverently consumed. The minister should be careful to make sure that no other particles from the host remain on the ground. As we see in the instruction from the bishops, the Precious Blood would be absorbed (customarily with a purificator) and the area attentively and reverently washed with water which would then be disposed of properly. ©LPI

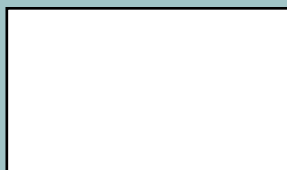
