Pastor's Message — From Father Dave

"My brothers and sisters, we believe that all the ties of friendship and affection which knit us as one throughout our lives do not unravel with death. Confident that God always remembers the good we have done and forgives our sins, let us pray..."



These comforting words, taken from the Order of Christian Funerals, are spoken at the beginning of the Church's Vigil Service for the Deceased. It speaks the reality that we celebrate in the Funeral rites of the Church. We believe that, even after death, we are still bound together with those who have gone into eternal life before us. We are supported by their prayers, as they are supported by ours. As we face the stark reality of death, the Church confidently proclaims that God has created each person for eternal life and that Jesus, by His death and resurrection, has broken the chains of sin and death. When a person dies, we mourn their loss, but we also celebrate and give thanks to God for the gift of a life which has been returned to the Father.

On this celebration All Souls' Day and in this month of November, we remember all those who have gone before us in death, especially our family members, friends, and members of our parish family. In a special way, we remember those who have died in the past year. This month of remembrance gives us a chance to recognize that we have been touched by the love of many people, and we give thanks for those who are now in eternal life, preparing a place for us.

As we gather for the celebration of the Eucharist, let us be especially mindful that we are united in prayer and in love with the saints and all who have gone before us in death. The Eucharist is the foretaste of the heavenly banquet, and it is there, in the kingdom of God, that we will all be reunited one day with those whom we loved in this life.

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen.

Honoring Our Heroes

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Question: What do Catholics believe about the resurrection of the dead?

Answer: Every Sunday, we proclaim in the Creed that we believe "in the resurrection of the body." Does that mean Christ's resurrection or our own? Both! Jesus' resurrection is part of the work of salvation, but it's also a sign of what's to come. While death separates our bodies and our souls, this was not the intention of God when He first created us. It's an effect of original sin. At the end of time, our bodies and our souls will be reunited.

Scientifically, we may have questions about this, since bodies decompose over the course of centuries. Or what about the saints, whose relics are spread around the earth? How the resurrection will happen is a mystery. But we know that our resurrected body will be our body. If we are in heaven, our body will be in a glorified state. Some theologians speculate what this glorification will be like based on Jesus' resurrected body. Will we be able to walk through walls? Will we eat, since Jesus broke bread with his disciples? We don't really know the answers to these questions. We do know, however, that we will be free from the effects of the fall (such as sickness and pain) and physical defects that occurred in life. Christ redeems us as whole persons, body and soul! ©LPi

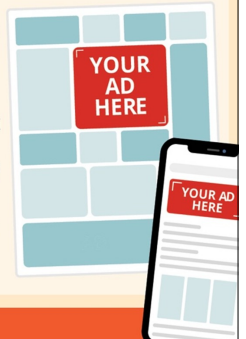

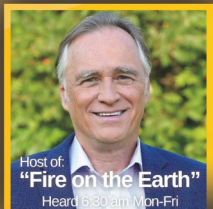
